## Please find our response below:

1. Into how many languages does the Trust translate patient information as of 1<sup>st</sup> November 2014?

It is not possible for advocacy to answer this. The advocacy service is not involved in the translation and production of patient information this is likely to be carried out by individual services and or communications.

2. During the last financial year (i.e. April 2013 – March 2014) how much did the Trust spend on the following: (a) translation of written information published or printed for the benefit of patients/carers (e.g. leaflets or online information) (b) translation/interpretation services for patients/carers (i.e. to assist patients/carers with limited English during consultations, meetings and phone calls

If the Trust has difficulty in splitting up its costs into these different elements, please provide me with a 'global' figure for the amount spent on translation/interpretation for the financial year 2013/14

It is not possible to break down the costs into these areas as the Trust has an in-house bilingual advocacy service that provides these services via a number of ways i.e. internal staff, interpreters from external agencies and providers of telephone interpreting (see summary below).
