Dear Sir/Madam,

Thank you for your recent follow-up Freedom of Information request regarding Energy Efficiency at Homerton Hospital Trust.

The Trust can provide the following information:

Would it be possible for you to help me with my studies by providing the following information? I am trying to understand what the public sector is doing to save and generate energy.

Please state what energy efficiency projects you are considering in the next 1 -3 years. By energy efficiency i mean anything from LED lights, to Variable Speed Drives, to Solar, to Biomass. Many thanks for your help.

From the assessment we carried out, we have estimated that it will cost more than the 'appropriate limit' to consider your request.

Section 12 of the Act makes provision for public authorities to refuse requests for information where the cost of dealing with them would exceed the appropriate limit, which for public sector organisations is set at £450. This represents the estimated cost of one person spending 2.5 working days in determining whether the department holds the information, locating, retrieving and extracting the information
