Homerton University Hospital NHS Foundation Trust is a medium sized local hospital providing acute and community health services for Hackney, The City and surrounding communities and also provides a range of specialist services for a much wider population.

The Trust comprises of Homerton Hospital in Hackney and the Mary Seacole Nursing Home, situated in Shoreditch as well as Hackney and the City Community Health Services.

As one of London's designated peri-natal centres, the Homerton provides a highly specialised range of obstetric and neonatal services. A major capital expansion programme is in hand to accommodate 6000 births per annum and provide 40 neonatal intensive care cots.

Over 2500 staff are directly employed by the trust, with a further 1000 contracted to work for us or placed here for training. In the latter group are pre and post registration medical and health care professional trainees from the London Deanery, Barts and the London Medical School, City University and East London University.

Our accident and emergency department sees over 110 thousand patients per year.

Inpatient and outpatients' facilities are provided at Homerton.

Our patient workload incorporates local and specialist referrals. These include new referrals, postoperative and long term follow ups and patients being assessed prior to surgery.

The Trust provides services to people with all health and social care needs.

#### 4. Maternity care at Homerton Hospital

Our maternity service provides maternity care for nearly 5000 women and their babies each year, during pregnancy, labour, birth and up until one month after birth.

During pregnancy, we offer both midwifery-led care (in hospital and in the community) and consultant-led care (provided by our expert multi-disciplinary team based at the hospital).

Our midwives look after women at the hospital antenatal clinic, at local GP surgeries and children's centres, and at the new Shoreditch Maternity Centre.

For your labour and birth, we provide a home birth service as well as hospital-based care during labour and birth (for reasons of medical safety, home birth is available to City & Hackney residents only and dependent on individual assessment).

In addition, Homerton is a leading regional neonatal centre and we will be able to provide the highest quality specialist care for your baby after birth if needed.

#### 5. Community Health Services

The community health services are provided in the patient's own home or from a community location.

## 6. Mary Seacole Nursing Home

The Mary Seacole nursing home is a purpose built, 50-bedded, mixed-sex home for frail older people and respite residents, aged 60 and over.

Qualified registered nurses and health care support workers are responsible for the day-to-day care of all our residents. Accommodation consists of a single furnished room with en-suite bathroom, which residents are encouraged to personalise. Shared areas include dining room, lounges and activity rooms as well as private gardens where residents can sit in the warmer weather. Referrals to the home are made via the continuing care panel.

The respite service consists of seven beds. These enable older people to take a break away from home in relaxing surroundings.

Referrals are made via GP, care managers, social workers, carers' liaison nurse and families.
